Travel Rules Travel for activities will be considered an extension of the classroom, and all school rules will apply. Students who travel or are engaged in any out-of-district, school-sponsored activity, are expected to abide by the following rules, as well as those that are included in the Activities Agreement and any that are established by the adviser, coach, or chaperone.

- 1. Chaperone house family rules or host school rules must be followed.
- 2. Curfew on weeknights is 10:00 pm and 12:00 pm on weekends, or one hour after the end of an activity.
- 3. I understand that there will be no overnight visit with friends while participating.
- 4. During a school-sponsored trip, a student may be released to an immediate family member (parent/guardian, sibling, aunt, uncle) who is at least 21 years of age under the following conditions.
- 1. Written parent/legal guardian permission is required in writing to the school principal statin to whom they wish the student to be released
- 2. I understand that my property is my responsibility, and that YKSD is not responsible for any items that are lost, damaged or stolen.
- 3. There shall be no changes in housing assignments, except in the case of an emergency, and then only with the coach's or adviser's expressed permission.
- 4. Students must inform their chaperones of their intended whereabouts.
- 5. Students are to call their coach or advisor immediately if any problems arise.
- 6. No student who is traveling for a school-sponsored activity may drive any vehicle.
- 7. Students are not allowed to partake of alcoholic beverages, drugs, vape, energy drinks or tobacco. If a student violates this rule, the school coach or advisor will be notified immediately. Students are expected to remove themselves from any situation where alcoholic beverages or drugs are being used and to contact their coach/advisor.
- 8. I will practice good health and hygiene habits, including limiting sugary snacks.
- 9. I will use appropriate language at all times.
- 10. Students are responsible for cleaning up after themselves when they leave a bus, plane, home, school, or dorm.
- 11. Students are to be sensitive to the rights and comforts of other plane passengers.
- 12. If traveling during the winter, students are required to wear proper winter gear, and must have in their possession a winter hat, winter coat, snow pants, gloves, boots, and a winter sleeping bag.

RELEASE OF STUDENTS TO NON PARENTS/GUARDIANS ON SCHOOL TRIPS

During a school-sponsored trip, a student may be released to an immediate family member (parent/guardian, sibling, aunt, uncle) who is at lease 21 years of age under the following conditions.

- Written parent/legal guardian permission is required in writing to the school principal statin to whom they wish the student to be released and the purpose for the release. The submitted request must contain the third party's physical home address and pertinent phone numbers.
- The head coach or sponsor will be responsible for the release.
- The student will only be released to the family member at the conclusion of the student activity, not during the activity or between scheduled events. Upon release, at the conclusion of the activity, the coach is no longer responsible for the student for the remainder of the trip. If the student is traveling back with the team or group, it is the relative's responsibility to make sure the student arrives at the team or group's departing location in a timely manner for the trip home.
- It is the responsibility of the coach to address this with the parents/guardians and student.
