

Using Component Ratings to Establish Domain Ratings

Use component ratings to establish domain ratings. To roll up component ratings into one of the domain ratings, evaluators will use the following operating principles:

Exemplary	A teacher should receive a domain rating of <i>Exemplary</i> if the teacher has received <i>Exemplary</i> ratings in at least half of the components of the domain, with the remaining components rated no lower than <i>Proficient</i> .
Proficient	A teacher should receive a domain rating of <i>Proficient</i> if the teacher received no more than one component rated <i>Basic</i> , with the remaining components rated <i>Proficient</i> or <i>Exemplary</i> .
Basic	A teacher should receive a domain rating of <i>Basic</i> if the teacher received no <i>Unsatisfactory</i> component rating and two or more <i>Basic</i> component rating.
Unsatisfactory	A teacher should receive a domain rating of <i>Unsatisfactory</i> if any one component is rated <i>Unsatisfactory</i> .

Visual of operating principals mentioned above aligned with YKSD's three components per domain.
