



Carpentry Skills Training Program

Yukon-Koyukuk School District (YKSD) is seeking proposals for a one-week Carpentry Skills Training Program to be conducted at one of our rural sites/schools. The program's objective is to provide students with hands-on experience and foundational knowledge in carpentry, with a specific focus on constructing wood sheds or other relevant projects. We invite interested training providers to submit proposals including the cost per student, based on a participant range of 10 to 16 students.

Program Details:

- **Duration:** The training program should span at least one week to ensure comprehensive skill development and project completion.
- **Participants:** The program will accommodate a participant range of 10 to 16 students, based on interest and availability.
- **Carpentry Skills Training:** The proposed curriculum should cover essential carpentry skills, including measuring, cutting, joining, framing, and finishing. Emphasis should be placed on safety protocols, proper tool usage, and construction techniques relevant to wood sheds or selected projects.
- **Project-Based Learning:** The program should provide students with hands-on opportunities to apply their newly acquired carpentry skills in the construction of wood sheds or practical projects. Students should experience the entire construction process, from planning to completion.
- **Resources:** The training provider should outline the necessary resources, including tools, materials, safety equipment, and any additional support required for successful program delivery.

Proposal Submission:

Interested training providers are requested to submit proposals to the Yukon-Koyukuk School District. Proposals should include the following information:

- Overview of the proposed Carpentry Skills Training Program, including program structure and objectives.
- Qualifications and experience of the training provider and instructors, including certifications or relevant credentials in carpentry or construction.

- Cost per student based on a participant range of 10 to 16 students, including all necessary training materials, tools, and project supplies.
- Any additional relevant information or supporting materials.

Evaluation and Selection:

- Proposals will be evaluated based on past vendor performance and capacity for continued training.
- Proposals will be reviewed weekly, and multiple vendors may be selected based on demand from families.
